(Hendersonville, N.C.) Skin cancer is the most common form of cancer in the United States and each year there are more new cases of skin cancer than that of breast, prostate, lung and colon combined.

To help educate and increase awareness of skin cancer, Pardee will offer free skin cancer screenings on Saturday, June 11, from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. at the Pardee Health Education Center, located in the Blue Ridge Mall.
