Get Vaccinated

Pardee encourages you and your staff to get a free, safe and effective vaccine at one of the many available locations throughout our region. We are here to help and can administer a vaccine at select Urgent Care locations, but the primary goal is to get a vaccine - as soon as possible and at a place that works for you.



Get tested

Pardee Urgent Care locations offer new accurate, reliable and [rapid 4-in-1 COVID-19 tests](#). Feeling Sick? COVID-19, Flu A, Flu B, and RSV (a common respiratory virus) are all viruses that present with very similar symptoms but require very different approaches to treatment. It's important to determine which virus you may have and therefore the best course of action to get you feeling good again.



Get treatment

Pardee has been providing life saving REGEN-CoV (Regeneron) treatment since February of this year. Thanks to a grant from the Henderson County Commissioners, we've been able to expand our clinic to provide monoclonal antibody treatment to more people who need it, resulting in far fewer hospitalizations and deaths among patients who contract COVID and receive the treatment.
